



About GRENADA

- Grenada, known as the 'Isle of Spice,' is one of the most magnificent islands in the West Indies. Un-spoilt and exotic, it astounds visitors with its wildly jagged mountain peaks, hidden coves, spice plantations, and lush verdant rainforests. Its beaches are idyllic, with white or golden sand, palm trees, and the delicate aroma of the island's native spices.
- In addition to its scenery, Grenada offers culture, fun, and friendliness typical of the authentic Caribbean life – making Grenada the perfect place in which to live, work and play.
- ♦ The nation of Grenada, measuring 344 km2, is composed of three key islands: Grenada and its sister islands Carriacou and Petite Martinique. Each is beautiful and rich in culture, historic sites, fresh culinary delights, and much more. Carriacou is only a 90-minute boat ride from St. George's, the nation's capital city.
- Grenada was traditionally inhabited by Carib Indians who migrated from the South American mainland. The island was originally known as Camerhougue, but Christopher Columbus renamed it 'Concepción Island' when he visited it in 1498. Successive Spanish sailors found it to be so evocative of Andalucía's green mountain scenery that they named it after the city of Granada.
- Grenada was a French and British colony but gained independence from the United Kingdom on February 7, 1974.
- Grenada's population is highly educated and has a very high literacy rate. St George's University hosts 6,000 students from over 140 countries, offers faculties of Medicine and Veterinary Science, and has been operating for thirty-five years. In addition, a full medical teaching hospital will be developed in the near future.
- Large-scale tourism is a recent phenomenon, and Grenada is largely undiscovered and full of opportunity.

QUALIFICATIONS

- ♦ The Grenada Citizenship by Investment Program was launched in 2013 under the regulations of the Grenada Citizenship by Investment Act.
- In recent years tourism has become the leading sector for foreign direct investments in Grenada. Another service sector on the rise is the offshore financial industry, which together with strong performances in construction and manufacturing, have also contributed to growth in national output.
- As part of its strategy to attract foreign direct investment, the Grenadian government is working closely with a select number of businesses related to tourism, agriculture and manufacturing. Through the implementation of the program, the government also hopes to create investment opportunities that will bring about sustainable employment.
- ♦ To qualify for citizenship, applicants must fulfill one of the investment options below in addition to the following criteria:
- Be of outstanding character.
- Hold no criminal record.
- · Have a high personal net worth.

BENEFITS

- ♦ Full citizenship, including the right to work, live, and study in Grenada.
- No requirement to reside in Grenada before, during, or after application.
- ♦ Visa-free travel to more than 120 countries (EU & Schengen; China, UK and Canada)
- No taxes on global income, capital gains, gifts, wealth and inheritance.
- ♦ No interview or education or management experience required.
- ♦ Well known, stable, and established investment environment.
- ♦ Multi-Citizenship allowed
- ◊ E-2 treaty 'Investor Visa' signed between Grenada and the United States allows citizens of Grenada to apply for a substantial business in the U.S. and eligible to operate after approval.



Cost & Process

To acquire the Citizenship of Grenada, an applicant can either contribute/donate to the National Transformation Fund (NTF) or Purchase a real estate from the list of Government Approved projects.

INVESTMENT OPTIONS

I. National Diversification Fund (NDF)

- Under this option applicants pays a non-refundable US\$200,000 to the Government of Grenada to qualify the investor and his/her spouse and up to 2 dependents*.
- A contribution of US\$25,000 is required for any additional dependent after the third dependent.
- ♦ Single applicant: US\$150,000**.

**If the main applicant is married but does not intend to include the spouse in the application, an additional US\$ 8,000 fee for due diligence & processing is applicable.

*Qualifying dependents includes: Spouse, Children below the age of 30; Parents or Grandparents of the Main Applicant or spouse above the age of 55 (dependent parents can be in an application together even if one of them is aged 55 and above).

II. Real State

Purchase of an authorized real estate with minimum value of US\$350,000.

The investment is subject to a minimum holding period of four (4) years.

In addition to the real estate investment, the following Government Fees apply:

♦ Single or Family of up to 4:

Single Applicant: US\$50,000.

Couple or up to Family of 4 (Main Applicant + up to 3 qualifying dependents): US\$50,000.

Every Additional dependent: US\$25,000 per additional dependent after the third qualifying dependent.

PROCEDURE

The following table breaks down the application process into basic steps.

Each step must be completed before continuing to next.

Within 1-3 weeks	DOCUMENTS COMPLETION & SUBMISSION	 STEP 1 Payment of Initial fees. Completion of all the required documents & Forms. STEP 2 Second Payment as per the invoice. Citizenship application submission to the CBIU.
1 to 3 weeks	CONFIRMATION	 STEP 3 Confirmation from the CBIU for receiving all documents in order. Background check starts.
Up to 4 months	DUE DILIGENCE & APPROVAL	 STEP 4 Background checking completes within 90 days. CBIU issues Approval Comfort letter. STEP 5 Full Payment due within 30 days. STEP 6 Certificate of Registration (COR) issued within 14 – 20 days Passport issued after the COR (Citizenship certificate)
